The Harrison Township Agenda Meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Chairman William Heasley.

Commissioners William Heasley, William Poston, Robin Bergstrom, Gary Lilly and Chuck Dizard were present.

Mr. Heasley announced that prior to the Agenda Meeting, the Board held an executive session to discuss personnel issues.

#### AGENDA

Ordinance No. 2005 – Establishing reasonable costs of collection for delinquent Local Service Taxes and impose the cost of such collection upon the delinquent taxpayer, as authorized by the Local Tax Enabling Act.

Resolution No. 1826 – Authorizing a Treevitalize Application for the Fall of 2019 Award.

Tom Cajka advised that the Tree Committee will be applying for the Township to receive fifty trees through W. PA Conservancy. The planting will take place in the fall along Sycamore Street in Natrona and along Union Avenue in Natrona Heights. Absolutely no cost to the Township.

Authorize 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter 2019 Allocations in amount of \$1,750.00 to all three Volunteer Fire Companies.

Authorize Partial Payment Application No. 2 in amount of \$23,154.40 to Ron Gillette, Inc. for work on the Linden Street Demolition, as recommended by NIRA Consulting Engineers, Inc.

Authorize advertisement of Ordinance No. 2006 – Amending the Township Zoning Ordinance and changing the Township Zoning Map by rezoning a portion of the R-1, Single Family Residential District, in the vicinity of Kingston Drive, Parkway Avenue, Meadow Street and Overland Street, to R-2, Two-Family Residential District.

Announce April 27, 2019 as Annual Earth Day in Harrison Township, from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. This will also be clean up day in the Township.

Accept resignation from Thomas Grant of the Zoning and Ordinance Department effective January 22, 2019.

Mr. Dizard said that Grounded Strategies are proposing to work with us in putting together a State CITF Grant, where they would work with us with their technical expertise on GIS mapping of our vacant properties so we can use the mapping for some of our planning demolition and development and put together a strategy package. It will not cost the Township anything. They're non-profit, out of North Hills. Very, very impressive. We'll need a motion on Monday, that we approve them applying for a grant on behalf of Harrison Township.


