BEING PREPARED


Although you may never encounter a robbery situation, it's always a good idea to be prepared in advance. For example, it's important to remain calm during the event. The calmer you are, the less chance there is for the robber to become excited and possibly dangerous. When you're calm, you'll also be better able to observe the person or persons involved more thoroughly and accurately.

TIPS ON BEING A GOOD OBSERVER

In getting a description, try to be systematic. Look from head to foot, examing and mentally noting as many details about the robber as you can. As for height, weight and age, compare him/her with yourself or someone you know. For example, he/she is either smaller, heavier, older, etc.

Don't trust your memory too long; it can deceive you. As soon as the robber has departed the premises and you have given the alarm to the police, use this form to capture as much information about the robber as you can. Be sure to include every detail you can recall. No matter how small it may seem, it could be important.

Below are examples of items associated with the robber that you may encounter and which should be part of your description.



Being able to identify different types of weapons will also improve the usefulness of your description.


